DESCRIPTION Floraturf is a flora-rich wild flower turf produced on a compost base with a reinforcement incorporated.

INSTALLATION Floraturf requires similar ground preparation as other turf, but will perform better in the long run if it is laid on low fertility soils that are relatively free-draining. It roots readily into most media and is stable on flat or sloping ground.

Floraturf is particularly useful as an alternative green roof material where it is less fussy over the growing media as other competing products.

The one area that Floraturf differs from normal turf is the amount of applied moisture required to aid establishment. Floraturf requires to be kept moist for the first 30 days after laying.

MAINTENANCE The turf can be mown in March to remove any winter growth (optional) at a height of 75-100mm and again after flowering has ceased (essential) (August-September) at a height of 75-100mm and the mowings/hay should be left to dry and moved around to allow seed shedding back into the sward. The hay should be removed later.
